

Reception-

This term we will be focusing on the unit it's me 1, 2 and 3. We will be representing, comparing and composing number to 3. This will also link to shape as we investigate how many sides some 2D shapes have. We will be continuing with Monster Phonics, learning to blend and segment sounds to support our reading and writing skills. As well as mark making in many different ways, practising letter formation and writing our names.

Year 1-

This term we will continue to build on our writing skills while investigating fiction, non-fiction and poems in relation to significant events and remembrance. We will also continue with Monster Phonics and the pre-cursive handwriting scheme.

Science-

Computing-

This term we will be learning how to use a range of technology safely while using it to create digital content.
